Approved Minutes of the Meeting

The third meeting of the Ad Hoc Faculty Senate GAI Committee convened at 3:02pm on March 21, 2025, in room 135F of Thomas Boyd Hall at the LSU campus, with the Chair and the Secretary being present. No public comments were offered.

Singh moved to approve the minutes from the meeting on 14 March 2025. The motion was approved unanimously.

Osborn initiated an overview of the Boston University's Generative AI Assistance (GAIA) policies. All committee members extensively discussed several key points: i. Critical embrace of GAI recognizing both benefits and challenges; ii. Different perspectives-subgroups exploring varying uses and concerns of GAI; iii. GAI detectors-whether to disclose their use to students/reliability issue; and iv. Emphasis on process over product-course assessments encourage students to reflect on their use of GAI rather than focusing on final outputs.

Singh designated subgroups to develop sample syllabus statements on GAI usage for the next meeting: (1) Pittman and Norton for process-oriented samples possibly suited for law/tech courses with GAI; (2) Lee and Paul for statements with clear rationale about the (non)use of GAI; and (3) Osborn and Tyagi for process-driven instruction and academic integrity.

Osborn made a motion to adjourn the meeting at 4:00pm. The motion was approved unanimously and the meeting adjourned.
